Subject: Natural Gas Export

I am writing to oppose the easy export of natural gas from the U.S. It is utter folly to pursue LNG export on every level.

Extracting the gas loads the ground and the air with severe pollutants. Procuring the gas allows literally tons of methane to be directly vented or to escape from the woefully sloppy system designs utilized for extraction. Methane is well-established as a global greenhouse gas equivalent to burning coal. Transmission pipelines are infamous for their the destruction they wreak on ground water, wells, natural habitats, private property rights, conservation land bisection, and the horrors of explosions which must be the envy of every terrorist on the planet.
