This email is being provided to individuals that have previously indicated an interest in the Clean Line Plains & Eastern Application under Section 1222 of the *Energy Policy Act of 2005*. Today, the Department of Energy issued a notice in the *Federal Register* (<https://www.federalregister.gov/articles/2015/04/28/2015-09941/application-for-proposed-project-for-clean-line-plains-and-eastern-transmission-line>) that requests public comment on Clean Line's updated application. The project addressed in the application would include an overhead \pm 600-kilovolt (kV) high voltage, direct current electric transmission system and associated facilities with the capacity to deliver approximately 3,500 megawatts primarily from renewable energy generation
