

Dear Department of Energy,

I am opposed to Clean Line's Project being approved. My family has worked hard for the property where our home is located. If Clean Line's Project is approved, my family will suffer the financial burden resulting in the loss of property value of our home and land. Clean Line has a proposed route that will run 85 meters along the border of our property, with no compensation. The majority of farmers I have spoken to are against Clean Line's Project even with compensation. Farmers do not want these massive towers to interfere with their farming practices and to cross farm land that has been in their family for years. My Amish neighbors with large families fear the potential health risks resulting from these lines. Please deny Clean Line's Project and look for alternative choices of energy that will not place the burden on people who have worked hard to build their homes and livelihood.

I beseech you to aggressively continue your efforts and take a more visible stand in the defense of property owners who are clearly put in a position of disadvantage as DOE partners with Clean Line. We are not against well thought out clean energy projects and we are not "NIMBYs".
