Rural Energy for America Program

Purpose: The Section 9007 Rural Energy for America Program provides grants and guaranteed loans for agricultural producers and rural small businesses to purchase and install renewable energy systems and make energy efficiency improvements.

- "REAP" or "9007"
- Grants and Guaranteed Loans
- Grants can be used to pay up to 25% of total project costs
- \$500,000 limit for renewable energy systems and \$250,000 limit for energy efficiency improvements
- Energy Audit and Feasibility Study grants are also available
