Proposed Action or Project Description:

The U.S. Department of Energy proposes to conduct a joint study with the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission on the performance of the engineered soil cover at the Shirley Basin South disposal site. This proposed study involves excavation of the cover material itself and of undisturbed portions of the nearby source of the cover material to study the soil formation process at this location. Excavations would extend through the cell cover system to the bottom of the radon barrier. No tailings or contaminated material would be moved at any of the locations. All excavations would be restored at the conclusion of the project. This study supports a larger effort to evaluate the long-term performance of engineered soil covers at LM managed sites nationwide.

This Categorical Exclusion Evaluation (LM 22-17) evaluates the potential impacts of the pedogenesis study. Environmental considerations include air emissions/air quality; noise; solid waste generation; chemical storage on site; regulated quantities of petroleum used or stored on site; wetlands impacted; cultural/archaeological resources present; radioactive materials/soils; and surface (ground) disturbance. Disclosed environmental effects were found to be minor. Best management practices would be applied to further minimize potential negative environmental effects.
