- *Reservation purchased in 1937
- *Successfully fought copper ore mine and purchased the rights
- *Over 1,500 tribal members
- *One of the best wild rice bed in Wisconsin

- *Started in 2015
- *\$600,000 ICDBG
- *\$300,000 Tax credit investor
- *49 Homes with rooftop Solar PV Panels and Fronius Inverters
- *Size 273 kW
- *\$1.3 Million in energy savings over 30 years
- *Completed in December 2016

*Started in 2015

*\$1 Million DOE grant

*\$1,152,925 Tax credit investor

*17 Tribal businesses and 3 homes with Solar PV panels and Fronius Inverters on rooftops

*2 Tribal businesses with Solar PV and Fronius Inverters on the ground

*Size 606 kW

*\$2.7 Million in energy saving over 30 years

*Completed in December 2016

- *Decrease Tribe's carbon footprint and energy costs
- * Provide training and job opportunities for tribal members in rapidly growing field
- *Provide a cost-effective, clean energy model for other low-income Tribal communities
