Roberts: There is a nomination on the table for Val Francis as vice chair. Any other nominations for board vice chair? No more nominations. All in favor of Val as vice chair raise your hand.

Nomination carried (11 approved, 0 opposed, 0 abstained, 0 recused)

Roberts: Congratulations Val.

Adaption of FY 2015 Work Plan:

Henderson: If we may prior to moving on to the work plan, I would like Mr. Carr to address the board and explain the regulatory process and what we will be going through in the near future.

Bennett: I would like to make a motion to approve the FY 2015 proposed work plan.

Caudill: I second the motion to approve.

Roberts: There is a motion on the table to approve the FY 2015 work plan. All in favor raise your hand.

Motion carried (12 approved, 0 opposed, 0 abstained, 0 recused)

Public Comment:

Sea: Geoffrey Sea, Neighbors for an Ohio Valley Alternative. I am going to go fast because I have a lot to say tonight. Our group contends that DOE is currently in violation of federal law in terms of both these proposed decisions. The decision making process has been corrupted and that if DOE proceeds with a ROD on the schedule discussed tonight, it will be in violation of Federal law. It contends, specifically eight things.

- #1 It is illegal to collapse these two decisions into one. We have been told for years that DOE would first make a decision that would be completed on the D&D process buildings and that would serve as a basis for later making a decision on waste disposition. That is the logical way to proceed. If you do the two together then it presumes that you have already made a decision on the building D&D. You cannot make a decision on waste disposition until you know what you are doing with the building D&D. So, in fact, by collapsing the two decisions together you are admitting that the process was done illegally, that you have already made a decision that was improperly made.
- We contend that Fluor and other contractors at this site have conducted hidden illegal shipments of waste, specific to the Paducah site. This is now under investigation by the U.S. Department of Justice and other law enforcement agencies. We contend that it was illegal to proceed with making these decisions until the results of those investigations are complete and the community and public know what actually has conspired in the past at the site in terms of corrupt illegal activity.
- #3 We contend that DOE has not disclosed what happened to the uranium-decommissioning fund that was supposed to fund cleanup of the two gaseous diffusion plants. And now is the idea that this is supposed to be now funded by a barter agreement that could be in violation of federal law. For this community to make sound decisions about the future, we at least need an account of what happened to that fund that was set up by congress to fund this process.
- We contend that DOE has illegally provided financial support for USEC knowing that there will be no commercial centrifuge plant on this site. But wanting to secure a Record of Decision on waste disposition, meaning an on-site waste disposal site, while a centrifuge or centrifuge plant is technicality on the books before acknowledging that there will not be a centrifuge plant, which would remove the reason for placing an on-site waste cell.
- #5 We contend that the Fluor contract was structured to secure an on-site waste cell from the beginning in violation of CERCLA and sound decision-making principles.
- We contend that the National Historical Preservation Act has been grossly violated at this site. That DOE has no acceptable solution under federal law of the impact of an on-site waste disposal cell on federally protected historical properties. For those of you who are new here you should know that DOE has been forced to

acknowledge as a result of archaeology studies that there are 53 previously unknown artifact sites on the DOE reservation, some of which are on the site of the proposed on-site waste cell.

#7 We contend that this body, the SSAB, has been composed and operated illegally as a rigged rubber stamp for pre-made decisions in violation of CERCLA. We hope that will change and the new members will be part of making that change.

We contend that the third alternative that was proposed and included in the original plans, which was an alternative that we suggested and was not discussed by Dennis Carr, has been illegally eliminated from consideration and that is in fact the best alternative for waste at this site. That would involve separating the waste into three streams, not two, so some of the mid-level contaminants not be put in an onsite waste cell, but transferred to another off-site facility within the region that would keep jobs in the region and be a lower cost alternative. Because of the way the contract for Fluor was originally, it was written to give them extra bonus fees for securing an on-site waste cell with public support. If you proceed along this schedule, you are looking at a major Federal lawsuit. We don't want to go that route, we have tried to discuss with DOE and Fluor these alternatives and asked that some kind of accommodations be reached. The local community is dead set against an onsite disposal facility. You all in this room know that, and that is being completely ignored.

Final Comments from the board:

Huber: Last time I was here, Carl Hartley told me that he had seen a cougar on site and I was wondering if ODNR was notified of the sighting. In addition, if anyone has a tape of the sighting, I would like to see it.

Simonton: I will check into that Brian.

Manson: There have been other sightings of some sort of cat.

Henderson adjourned the meeting.

Next Meeting: November 6, 2014

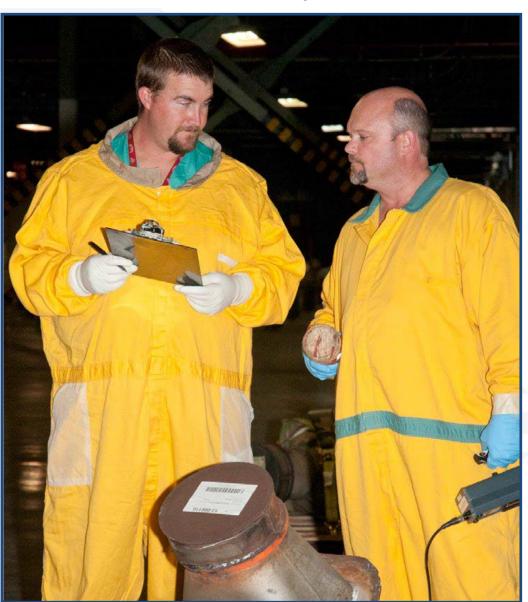

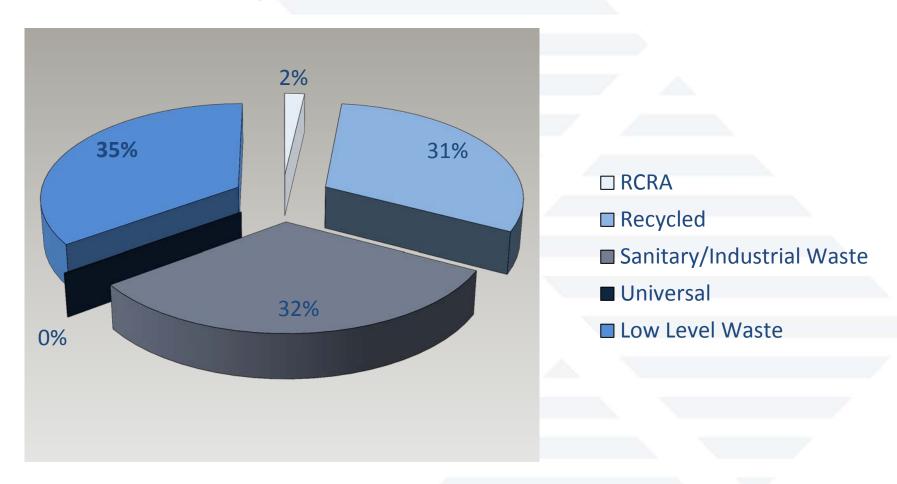
