Program or Field Office: U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) Office of Legacy Management (LM)

Project Title: Vegetation monitoring, weed control, fence repair, and routine maintenance at Gunnison, Colorado, Disposal

Site

Location: Gunnison, Colorado, Disposal Site

Proposed Action or Project Description:

DOE LM is proposing to perform vegetation monitoring and onsite weed control, using herbicide application; minor perimeter fence repairs; and other minor, nonground penetrating, site maintenance activities. These actions are necessary to maintain the site. See attached figure. The herbicide Milestone would be used for the onsite spraying of Canada thistle, a noxious weed. Management of offsite weeds is not included in this proposed action. Monitoring would be performed to identify weed locations. Other weed species may also be sprayed during this effort if the use of Milestone is appropriate for their management. Because the entire site is within Gunnison sage grouse (GSG) (a federally-listed threatened species) critical habitat, a site-specific biological assessment (BA) was prepared by LM and approved by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service (USFWS). Site activities, including the spraying of noxious weeds, would conform to the conditions and intent of the BA. Specifically, access to the site is prohibited annually from March 15 through July 15 during the GSG nesting season without prior USFWS consultation.

Because there are no established site roads, all on site travel is restricted to foot travel. A back-pack held applicator would be used for spot herbicide applications. All unused herbicide would be removed from the site upon completion of the work. Minor fence repair and minor maintenance activities (e.g., replacement of wiring, tightening of fencing and braces, replacing existing signs, replacing locks, adjusting gates) would also be performed as needed. Such activities would be limited to hand-powered tools and would exclude ground disturbing or penetrating and vegetation-disturbing activities or the use of chemicals. No onsite refueling of equipment or vehicles would be performed. Proposed activities are scheduled to begin after July 15, 2018 during the summer and fall field season. Long-term weed control and maintenance activities are indefinite. A Legacy Management Support contractor would perform the proposed activities.
