SUBJECT: Extension of Security Exercise Requirements and Authority for Under

Secretaries to Extend Certain Security Requirements Due to

Coronavirus Disease 2019

On March 13, 2020, the President issued a proclamation that the Coronavirus Disease 2019 (COVID-19) pandemic constitutes a national emergency, beginning March 1, 2020. In response to the COVID-19 pandemic, I issued two memoranda extending certain safety and security requirements. As stipulated in the memoranda, the Department revisited the list of requirements to determine which, if any, of the requirements should be extended further.

Based upon review and direct input from the Program and Site Offices, I am extending the following security requirements for another 180 days.

A blanket extension for the remaining security requirements contained in the initial memoranda is not warranted. However, the input received from the Program and Site Offices highlighted the disparity in the current COVID-19 operating environment for our sites and facilities, some of which are still operating in COVID-19 hotspots. Therefore, I hereby grant the Under Secretaries the authority to extend the following requirements for another 180 days based on a specific site's COVID-19 operating environment.
