ORDER GRANTING REQUEST  
TO AMEND AUTHORIZATION TO EXPORT NATURAL GAS  
TO REFLECT CORPORATE NAME CHANGE

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 3682-A

On July 17, 2015, the Department of Energy's (DOE) Office of Fossil Energy (FE) issued Order No. 3682<sup>1</sup> to the entity then-known as G2 LNG LLC (G2 LNG) under section 3(c) of the Natural Gas Act (NGA).<sup>2</sup> Under that order, G2 LNG is authorized to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (LNG) from the proposed G2 LNG Terminal, to be located in Cameron Parish, Louisiana, to any country with which the United States has, or in the future enters into, a free trade agreement (FTA) requiring national treatment for trade in natural gas

(FTA countries).<sup>3</sup> G2 LNG is authorized to export this LNG, on its own behalf or as agent for other entities, in a volume equivalent to 672 billion cubic feet per year (Bcf/yr) of natural gas for a 30-year term, beginning on the earlier of the date of first export or 10 years from the date the authorization was issued.<sup>4</sup>

On September 25, 2020, G2 LNG notified DOE/FE that its corporate name has been changed to “G2 Net-Zero LNG LLC” (G2 Net-Zero LNG).<sup>5</sup> Specifically, the entity now known as G2 Net-Zero LNG states that, on August 5, 2020, it amended its Certificate of Formation with the state of Delaware to change its corporate name.<sup>6</sup> G2 Net-Zero LNG asks DOE/FE to issue an order amending Order No. 3682 to reflect this name change. G2 Net-Zero LNG states that “[t]here has been no change in the corporate structure of the limited liability company, nor does this name change result in a change in control.”<sup>7</sup>

DOE/FE finds that G2 Net-Zero LNG’s request to amend DOE/FE Order No. 3682 to reflect its corporate name change is deemed consistent with the public interest, pursuant to NGA section 3(c).

### **ORDER**

Pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act (15 U.S.C. § 717b), DOE/FE hereby orders that:

A. The name of the authorization holder of DOE/FE Order No. 3682 is amended to G2 Net-Zero LNG LLC.

B. All obligations arising under DOE/FE Order No. 3682 no longer apply to G2 LNG LLC, and now apply to G2 Net-Zero LNG LLC.
