ORDER GRANTING REQUEST TO VACATE LONG-TERM, MULTI-CONTRACT AUTHORIZATION TO EXPORT LNG IN ISO CONTAINERS BY VESSEL TO NON-FREE TRADE AGREEMENT NATIONS IN CENTRAL AMERICA, SOUTH AMERICA, OR THE CARIBBEAN

DOE/FE ORDER NO. 3487-A

In 2014, the Office of Fossil Energy of the Department of Energy (DOE/FE) granted a long-term, multi-contract export authorization to Carib Energy (USA), LLC (Carib) in the abovecaptioned docket. On September 10, 2014, in Order No. 3487, DOE/FE authorized Carib to export domestically produced liquefied natural gas (LNG) in approved ISO IMO7/TVAC-ASME LNG containers from the proposed Floridian Facility in Martin County, Florida (Floridian Facility), in an amount up to the equivalent to 14.6 billion cubic feet per year (Bcf/yr) of natural gas for a term of 20 years to commence on the earlier of the date of first export or seven years from the date that the Order was issued. On October 22, 2020, Carib notified DOE/FE that it wishes to vacate this export authorization.¹ Carib states that it has made the decision to stop pursuing the export of LNG in ISO containers from the Floridian Facility in Martin County, Florida.²

DOE/FE finds good cause for granting Carib's request. Accordingly, pursuant to section 3 of the Natural Gas Act, the authorization granted to Carib in DOE/FE Order No. 3487 is vacated, effective immediately.
