DOE 2017 Grant Award

- Install 1.5 Mw PV System (with project redesign estimated for 2.4 Mw)
- \$1,000,000 federal award
- \$2.567 million Tribal Match
- Project end date 9/30/2022

Project Challenges since last Update

- Past Barriers & Current Status
 - Project Design & Installation (2018)
 - Solar system design tie-into local utility impacts to economic enterprise
 - Prolonged downtime revealed lack of sufficient backup generator power
 - Project extension requested for added generator capacity (2019)

Project Remedies in Process (2020)

- Increased backup power supply design parallel project supports Task 2
- Vendor selected (Task 3) contract in negotiations with COVID 19 safeguards
- Project Commissioning Fall 2021

 - 2015 EV charging stations were funded by a California Energy Commission Grant managed by the Bay Area Air Quality Management District
