Proposed Action or Project Description

American Recovery and Reinvestment Act:

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The Lac du Flambeau Band of Lake Superior Chippewa Indians proposes to install an approximate 27-ton, horizontal directional, closed-loop geothermal (ground-source heat pump) heating and cooling system for the Lac du Flambeau Tribal Natural Resources Complex. The geothermal system will reduce the need for liquefied petroleum space heating within the complex. The system will also be used as a demonstration for community outreach in order to promote renewable energy and alternatives to fossil fuel heating and cooling. The project is located adjacent to a new building with construction currently underway, and this area is a previously disturbed area that has been used as a parking lot for approximately 20 years. Twentyfour (24) horizontal directional bore wells will be drilled that will be connected to ten (10) water-to-air heat pumps, with sizes ranging from 1 ½ to 4 tons. A storm water pollution prevention plan has been developed, reviewed, and approved. The site has also been reviewed by the Lac du Flambeau Tribal Natural Resources Department and Lac du Flambeau Tribal Historic Preservation Office (which includes threatened and endangered species, as well as any impacts to archeological and cultural resources), and a permit has been issued granting permission to proceed with the project without restriction. The individual heat pumps are connected to an energy recovery ventilator unit. The unit takes building exhaust air through a heat wheel and recovers heat for incoming building outside ventilation air requirements. One 5ton, two-stage, water-to-water heat pump providing hot water to the in-floor radiant heating system will also be connected to the geothermal loop field.
