Rational for determination:

The U.S. Department of Energy (DOE) provided funding to the Wisconsin State Energy Office (SEO) under the DOE's American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009 State Energy Program (SEP). SEO selected Greenwhey Energy (GreenWhey) to receive \$3,500,000 in SEP funding (total project cost - \$26.5M).

GreenWhey would use federal funding for permitting, preliminary design, engineering costs, surveying, project management, other related administrative fees and costs (proposed project).

The Village of Turtle Lake is currently developing and selling lots in its industrial park. The full development of the GreenWhey project would consist of constructing a 100,000 sq ft. anaerobic digester facility in the industrial park to divert high-strength waste water that is currently being land-spread and turn it into energy, steam, hot water and electricity. DOE funds would not be used for final design, construction or operation of the facility.

DOE has determined the proposed use of federal funds is consistent with the actions in categorical exclusion A9 "Information gathering, analysis, and dissemination" and A11 "Technical advice and assistance to organizations" and is categorically excluded from further NEPA review.
