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Proposed Action Title: (0473-1554) Varentec Inc. - Compact Dynamic Phase Angle Regulators for Transmission Power Routing

Program or Field Office: Advanced Research Projects Agency - Energy

Location(s) (City/County/State): California, Georgia, Tennessee, and Wisconsin.

Proposed Action Description:

Funding will support development of Compact Dynamic Phase Angle Regulators (CD-PAR), a compact, low-cost power flow controller integrated with custom-wound transformers to control grid power flow, reducing the number of new transmission lines that will be required to meet increased renewable energy penetration.

ARPA-E has undertaken a review of the work to be performed under Phase I of the project, which consists of in-lab research and development and indoor industrial fabrication activities. ARPA-E has not undertaken a review of the work to be performed under Phase II of the project, which involves outdoor prototype field testing at utility sites operated by Southern Company that have yet to be identified.

Proposed work consists of (1) modeling, design, fabrication, and optimization of prototype CD-PAR units, (2) design and fabrication of 12 kV meshed AC network test bed and electrical transformers, and (3) prototype testing systems-level analysis of CD-PAR brassboard units in the 12 kV network test bed to validate CD-PAR performance. Project work will take place at Varentec Inc. (San Jose, CA), Georgia Tech University (Atlanta, GA), Electric Power Research Institute (Knoxville, TN), and Waukesha Electric Systems Inc. (Waukesha, WI).
