Dear David:

The most important problem facing our country today is our stagnant economy. This stubborn recession has increased unemployment substantially, ballooned the deficit and made it more difficult for American companies to compete abroad. As the Congress turns its attention toward this challenge, I want to share some thoughts on how I believe we can get the economy moving again.

First, I am among those who believe the case for a targeted Investment Tax Credit (ITC) is compelling:

- Business spending on equipment has actually declined since the 1990 business cycle trough. This contrasts with a sharp increase in the same months following the 1982 recession trough, when both a 10-percent ITC and a five-year depreciation write-off were in effect.
- Recent research at Harvard and MIT provides convincing evidence that the level of investment in business equipment is the strongest single factor contributing to economic growth and development.
- Recent research at Stanford indicates that the ITC is the most cost-effective tax device for promoting such investment.
- . Both academic research and reliable econometric simulations indicate that adoption of a 10-percent ITC would reduce this country's ultra-high capital cost of equipment investment by at least 11 percent. This reduction is essential for our international competitiveness.

However, when discussing how to pay for this business investment stimulant, we must not increase the basic corporate rate or the alternative minimum tax, which now is paid by almost half of America's corporations. Federal spending, which is now approaching 25% of the Gross National Product, should be reduced to keep the deficit from ballooning even more.

Second, I believe that early enactment of S.1220, the Johnston/Wallop National Energy Security Act, is another significant element in an economic recovery strategy.

Since 1980, employment in the oil and gas industry has declined by about 365,000 jobs. Every 100,000 barrels of imported oil displaced by domestic natural gas results in 16,000 new jobs being created in the United States, \$400 million of new investment, and a \$750 million positive improvement in our balance of payments. If we could replace 1,000,000 barrels of imported oil, we could create 160,000 jobs, or one-half of those lost since 1980, 2 Tcf of demand for domestic natural gas production, and a \$7.5 billion positive improvement in our balance of payments.

Technological advances have helped us expand the resource base to an estimated 1200 Tcf, which is equivalent to 200 billion barrels of oil. Other legislation, such as extension of Section 29 of the Internal Revenue Code, which offers non-conventional fuels credit for tight sands, coal bed methane and Devonian shale, is another strong national economic and strategic benefit. The tight sands credit has moved about 200 Tcf, or about 33 billion barrels equivalent of very tight sands natural gas resources, from the non-economically recoverable category.

Despite this enormous potential, during the first week in December, there were only 300 rigs drilling for natural gas. As a comparison, there were 500 rigs operating during the same week in 1990.

Another potentially significant spur to our economy is the reduction in the taxable rate for capital gains. I have noted with interest that many members of Congress already have endorsed or co-sponsored legislation to reduce the capital gains rate reduction. This is a very positive development.

In sum, I am convinced that the benefits to our economy, competitiveness, energy security and quality of life can be considerably improved if these economic and energy policies can become public law in 1992.

Please accept my best wishes to you and your family for the very best in 1992. I also extend my thanks to you for your continued effective work in Congress.

FACT SHEET

As part of his 90-day regulatory relief initiative, the president today announced several steps the Administration is taking to improve economic conditions in the natural gas industry and, at the same time, reduce utility rates to American consumers.

Noting the importance of the natural gas industry to the Nation's economic health and security, the President also acknowledged that the industry has fallen on hard times. The specific actions, all of which were called for in the President's National Energy Strategy, are as follows:

- 1. Remove Regulatory Barriers to Use of Natural Gas By Electric Utilities. Two additional actions will aliminate regulatory barriers that impede the use of natural gas by electric utilities:
- o <u>Final WEPCo Rule</u>. Within the next two weeks, EPA will issue a final rule (the so-called "WEPCo" rule) allowing electric utilities to make certain physical and operational changes at existing power plants without having to undergo expensive and time-consuming "new source" review. Because many of the modifications discouraged by the current regime are conversions to natural gas or gas co-firing generators, the final rule should lead to increased natural gas usage as well as lower electricity rates. The final rule will be substantially the same as EPA's proposed rule.
- Incentive Regulation for Electric Utilities and Natural Gas Pipelines. Currently, the manner in which the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission regulates the rates of electric utilities and natural gas pipelines reduces significantly their incentives to reduce costs. FERC Chairman Martin Allday and Commissioner Branko Terzic have proposed a policy statement permitting electric utilities and natural gas pipelines to choose "incentive regulation" as an alternative to traditional "cost-of-service" regulation. Over time, this new approach will increase consumption of natural gas by electric utilities as well as other consumers of natural gas. When fully implemented, moreover, a shift to incentive regulation should ultimately reduce total electricity and natural gas transportation costs by \$1-3 billion per year, thereby significantly reducing utility rates to consumers.

- 2. Remove Regulatory Barriers that Prevent Increased Usage of Natural Gas Vehicles. The Administration has already taken a number of steps to enhance usage of natural gas vehicles (NGVs), including substantial purchases of NGVs for use in government fleets. Two additional steps will lead to greater usage of natural gas vehicles:
- Remove Regulatory Barriers to the Sale of Compressed Natural Gas. Federal Energy Regulatory Commission Chairman Martin Allday has proposed for Commission action a rule that will remove perceived regulatory barriers to the sale of compressed natural gas (CNG) for use in motor vehicles. The rule will exempt from FERC jurisdiction most local sales of CNG. For distribution companies or others that cannot be exempted from FERC jurisdiction, the rule will allow FERC to grant a "blanket" certificate authorizing generically the sale of CNG for use in motor vehicles.
- Issue Emissions Standard for Natural Gas Vehicles. The Environmental Protection Agency will issue proposed emission standards for natural gas Vehicles that will allow them to compete on an equal basis with other vehicles. Specifically, the new standards will eliminate the separate total hydrocarbon standard for natural gas vehicles —— an onerous requirement that places natural gas vehicles at a disadvantage.

Dear Martin:

Late last year, I sent you a letter pointing out that the total shareholder return for owners of natural gas pipeline company stocks thus far in 1991 was substantially below the average return for all the stocks on the S&P 500. As the year finally ended up, during 1991 investors in natural gas pipeline companies received an overall return of -7.72% as compared to an overall return for the S&P 500 of +30.51%. The return for each individual company is shown on the attached.

The very weak and fragile financial condition of the natural gas pipeline industry was further highlighted this past week when Standard & Poor's put virtually all of the natural gas pipelines on credit watch-negative, as described in the attached wire service report. Although the warm winter and very depressed gas prices were primarily the reason for this action, Standard & Poor's also expressed concern about the regulatory uncertainty facing the industry. Specifically, Standard & Poor's states that "the pipeline industry continues to struggle with the seemingly endless transition to an open access environment" and that it "has little confidence in the ability of federal regulators to achieve comparability without further damage to pipelines financial profiles."

As you know, two large interstate pipelines, United Gas Pipeline and Columbia, have been forced into Chapter 11 Bankruptcy proceedings during the past few months. To my knowledge these are the first major interstate pipelines in the history of this industry that have ever had to seek bankruptcy protection. There is some speculation within the financial community that at least one or two other large interstate pipelines could be pushed over the edge into bankruptcy if FERC is not very careful in how it handles

implementation of the Mega NOPR, particularly with respect to recovery of transition cost.

As I did in my letter to you in December, I would again caution that the financial markets are extremely nervous about the natural gas pipeline companies and would urge that the Commission be sensitive to this nervousness, particularly as it considers the issue of transition costs under the Mega NOPR.

Dear Linda:

I thought you should see a copy of the attached.

As you can see, I remain very concerned about the financial stability of many of the natural gas pipeline companies. During the 1980's, the industry as a whole absorbed approximately \$3.6 billion of take or pay and other contract reformation costs. In an industry with about \$19 billion in total equity, this has left the balance sheets of most of the companies very weak. Any additional blow, such as requiring the pipelines to absorb some part of the transition cost caused by the Mega NOPR, could push one or more companies over the edge.

As you know, before leaving the department Henson Moore sent a letter to the Commission urging that it permit the pipelines to recover 100% of the transition costs resulting from the Mega NOPR and permit this recovery to take place in such a way as to not distort market signals. Anything you or others within the department can do to reinforce that recommendation with the Commission would be greatly appreciated.



Thank you for your letter of March 13, 1992, and for your comments and enclosed material about the financial condition of the U.S. natural gas pipeline industry.

As we have discussed, the Department of Energy is quite concerned about the general financial health of the natural gas pipeline industry. For this reason, and for reasons of basic equity, we continue to believe that FERC's final Mega-NOPR rule should permit pipelines to recover 100 percent of the transition costs caused by the Mega-NOPR, and to recover those costs in a way that minimizes market distortions.

Apart from the Mega-NOPR, we are continuing our efforts to remove impediments to greater use of natural gas. President Bush recently announced four initiatives in this area which are described in the enclosed White House Fact Sheet. We are working on other near-term measures to stimulate natural gas demand, and would welcome your suggestions.

For the longer term, moving to incentive rates should help the pipeline industry by better rewarding efficiency and innovation, and moving away from such heavy reliance on historical costs, which may bear little resemblance to replacement costs. We also expect National Energy Strategy elements, such as increased natural gas R&D, to open new markets for natural gas while allowing it to be produced more efficiently than ever before. This will help consumers, the environment and all the components of the natural gas industry.

We at the Department recognize that the natural gas pipeline industry has endured an extended period of transition(s). While this period of transition has been difficult, this Administration is committed to providing the pipeline industry with the flexibility it needs to effectively serve this nation's growing need for natural gas. We look forward to working with you to that end.

Dear Mr. President:

I apologize for writing you so often. But there is another issue currently pending before you about which I feel strongly.

I am writing to urge you to attend the upcoming United Nations Conference on Environment and Development scheduled for early June in Brazil and to support the concept of establishing a reasonable, non-binding, stabilization level of carbon dioxide and other greenhouse gas emissions.

This stabilization level should serve as a useful public policy guide, not a policy mandate. Moreover, I believe a market-based policy approach is the most cost effective and environmentally beneficial method to achieve greenhouse gas stabilization.

The demagoguery on both sides of this issue has been extraordinarily fierce. Frankly, I do not believe the oceans will boil in a few years if we don't address greenhouse gas emissions, but I also do not believe the U.S. will suffer from economic ruin if prudent steps are taken to reduce $\rm CO_2$ emissions in order to protect the global environment. In fact, if pursued through market-based policies, a reduction in greenhouse gases should result in a <u>cleaner environment</u>, cheaper electricity and more American jobs.

Among other industries, I am convinced that America's hard-pressed domestic natural gas industry would benefit substantially from a market-based approach to reducing CO_2 emissions. Natural gas is our cleanest fossil fuel and through its increased use in electric power generaton could play a major role in reducing CO_2 emissions and delivering lower electricity prices to consumers.

For example, as compared to a new coal-fired power plant, a natural gas-fired power plant reduces carbon dioxide emissions by 58 percent (the principal greenhouse gas), produces virtually zero sulfur dioxide emissions (the main cause of acid rain), and cuts nitrogen oxides by 80 percent (one of the main contributors to smog). Of course, a gas-fired plant does not produce any solid waste -- ash or sludge.

Natural gas electric power generation is not only cleaner, it is cheaper -- at least 30 percent less costly than coal-fired electricity generation over the life of the plant using long-term natural gas prices currently offered by Enron and others. Natural gas power plants have also prove to be significantly more reliable than coal or nuclear plants.

In addition to the opportunities for CO₂ reductions in the electric power industry, encouraging greater reliance on natural gas in homes, industry and vehicles and thus displacing foreign oil can reduce CO₂ emissions by 30 percent in each substitution and create American jobs. Displacing just 100,000 barrels of oil per day with domestic natural gas would create approximately 16,000 new American jobs, stimulate \$400 million of new investment in our economy and reduce our trade deficit by \$750 million. I personally believe natural gas could displace several hundred thousand barrels per day of oil over the next few years, and perhaps much more.

Finally, in connection with complying with the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990, some states are imposing mandates and providing tax incentives to preserve coal's dominance, regardless of cost, as an electricity generating fuel. Even though gas-fired or gas cofired generation is the lower cost and cleaner option in many cases, some are practicing an "Illinois First" or "Ohio First" policy by generation protecting an increasingly less favorable power technology. This is troubling because the victims of this protectionism, as always, are the consumers. The increased costs to consumers will continue to mount as electric utilities are induced to increase their investment in high carbon emitting equipment. Some limits on CO₂ emissions would require these states to carefully review these unsound and costly policies and, hopefully, result in more efficient solutions for our economy.

In summary, I urge you to provide leadership on this important global environmental issue. Not only will many U. S. industries benefit from measures to reduce greenhouse gas emissions, including the natural gas industry, but with the appropriate market-based

policies, these measures will result in a cleaner environment, cheaper electricity, more American jobs and a reduced trade deficit.

ENRON CORP. CHAIRMAN KEN LAY PROMOTES NATURAL GAS IN TESTIMONY BEFORE REPUBLICAN PLATFORM COMMITTEE

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE: Monday, April 13, 1992

America's strengths to achieve aggressive environmental protection and robust economic growth, according to Kenneth L. Lay, chairman and CEO of Enron Corp., in testimony today before the Republican Platform Committee in Kansas City. The country's record of productivity, prosperity and global leadership suggest that America has been successful playing to her strengths. The country should continue this success through national policies that promote one of America's greatest strengths—natural gas technology, Lay noted.

"In the interests of environmental stewardship, economic growth and job creation we must commit ourselves, as a matter of national policy, to enhance the natural gas industry's world leadership position," Lay said.

The environmental benefits of natural gas are readily identifiable, Lay said. A new natural gas combined cycle power plant eliminates 58 percent of the CO2 emissions produced by a comparably sized coal plant; produces virtually zero SO2 emissions; reduces NOx emissions by 80 percent, when compared with a new coal plant which meets U.S. New Source Performance Standards; and produces no solid waste.

According to Lay, environmental protection and economic growth do not have to be mutually exclusive. In fact, natural gas power generation is not only cleaner, it is at least 30 percent less costly, per kilowatt hour, than coal-fired electricity over the life of the plant, using natural gas supplies purchased under long-term contracts. Nuclear power costs about twice as much, per kilowatt hour, as gas fired combined cycle power generation. From an American competitiveness standpoint and a consumer perspective, it is in the public interest to produce electricity as efficiently and cost effectively as possible, Lay noted.

"A 1 cent per kilowatt hour decline in average consumer electricity prices would put an additional \$432 dollars per year into the pockets of an American family of four to save, invest or spend in our economy."

Encouraging greater reliance on natural gas in homes, industry and motor vehicles not only improves the environment, it can displace foreign oil, create jobs and reduce America's vulnerability to oil shocks, Lay noted.

A natural gas vehicle emits 80 to 90 percent less reactive hydrocarbons and carbon monoxide (CO), the main contributors to smog, than a gasoline fueled vehicle. Replacing oil with natural gas in stationary applications virtually eliminates SO2 and CO emissions and reduces CO2 by 30 percent.

Displacing foreign oil with domestic natural gas also creates American jobs.

"Approximately 16,000 new American jobs would be created and our trade deficit would be reduced by \$750 million for every 100,000 barrels per day of foreign oil displaced with domestic natural gas," Lay said. "Displacing 1 million barrels of foreign oil per day would increase domestic gas demand by 2 trillion cubic feet, create 160,000 new jobs, and reduce our trade deficit by \$7.5 billion."

The U.S. currently imports approximately 8 million barrels of oil per day, about 47 percent of total U.S. consumption.

According to the Department of Commerce, in 1991, the U.S. sent \$44 billion overseas to pay for foreign oil, accounting for two-thirds of the nation's total merchandise trade deficit. This amounts to more than our country's total trade deficit with Japan. As the war in the Persian Gulf demonstrated, America is vulnerable to oil shocks, Lay noted.

"We must reduce our reliance on oil and reduce America's vulnerability to unstable energy supplies," he said.

The U.S. has about 2.8 percent of the world's proven oil reserves compared to 65 percent in the Middle East. According to the Department of Energy, the U.S. has approximately 26 billion barrels of proved oil reserves and 35 billion barrels equivalent of natural gas and natural gas liquids proved reserves. America is believed to have at least 160 billion barrels equivalent of natural gas yet to be discovered and made available for production.

"With such large proved and potential natural gas supplies, it is indefensible that we use almost twice as much oil

in our economy as natural gas and that we import from foreign sources almost half of the oil we use," Lay said.

U.S. energy policy planners tend to be pessimistic about near-term and reasonably inexpensive improvements in natural gas technology and optimistic about long-term, very expensive breakthroughs in items such as clean coal and nuclear technology, Lay said. The bias is reflected in the National Energy Strategy even though it includes a large role for gas, he added.

"Natural gas provides about 24 percent of all the primary energy consumed in this country, but only receives 6.5 percent of the U.S. Department of Energy's (DOE) research and development (R&D) budget. Coal provides an equal energy share to the country, but receives 30 percent of DOE's R&D budget—almost five times that of natural gas. The federal budget for natural gas R&D is significantly underfunded and must be increased," he said.

Lay cited the need for the U.S. to reform natural gas pipeline regulation. Any significant effort by pipelines and their customers to serve expanding markets requires lengthy, costly and painstaking review by federal regulators, he said.

"This process stifles and discourages competitive innovation that would provide better service to customers and encourage economic growth. Regulators can safely grant much greater latitude to pipelines and customers to negotiate their own terms and conditions for service, acting more as a watchdog for abuse than a centralized planning agency for the industry."

The federal government also should encourage states to review and assess cost of service regulatory policies that may

discourage electric utilities from choosing the most economic and environmentally sound technology option for electric power generation, Lay said. State regulatory policies may be preventing electricity consumers from reaping the benefits of reliable, lower cost and cleaner electricity, he noted.

"I have proposed that electric utilities and state public utility commissions adopt the "Natural Gas Standard," which simply means no new coal or nuclear power generating stations should be built unless they produce electricity cleaner, cheaper and more reliably than gas combined cycle plants."

According to Lay, natural gas could become the dominant primary energy source in North America by early next century if the correct federal and state policies are implemented.

Enron Corp., America's leading natural gas company with more than \$13 billion in revenues and \$10 billion in assets, operates the nation's largest natural gas transmission system; markets natural gas, natural gas liquids crude oil and refined products nationally and worldwide; owns 84 percent of Enron Oil & Gas Company, one of the country's largest independent (non-integrated) natural gas exploration and production companies; is one of the largest independent developers and producers of electricity in the United States and the United Kingdom, with extensive experience in combined heat and power installations; and is a leading purchaser and marketer of long-term natural gas supplies. Enron Corp. is traded under the ticker symbol, "ENE."

Dear Mr. Speaker:

It was my privilege to testify before Congressman Phil Sharp's Energy and Power Subcommittee in 1990 regarding items which ultimately were refined and included in H.R.776. I also appeared before Secretary of Energy Watkin's public hearings regarding development of a national energy strategy and during the Senate Energy and Natural Resources Committee hearing on S.2166. Therefore, I feel that the development of H.R.776 and S.2166 has been a thoughtful and deliberative process by those in the Congress with primary responsibility for energy policy.

Passage by the House of H.R.776 has been reported to be among your priorities for this Congress, and it appears that your efforts and those of your colleagues could be successful, unless extraneous and potentially harmful provisions are included at the last moment.

H.R. 776 is a bill which stresses conservation, research and development; aims to streamline the regulatory process; and promotes development of consumer-oriented independent power and efficient natural gas. H.R. 776 is a sound and balanced piece of legislation, and it deserves the support of the nation, the Congress and the Bush Administration.

Most of the amendments which were added to H.R. 776 by the Interior Committee were considered during the five years of Congressman Sharp's committee hearings, but they were found to be too restrictive in regard to a balanced policy to meet our energy needs through the next century. I am aware that President Bush has written to you to express his concerns regarding proposals which would negate the joint efforts of the Administration and the Congress to produce a bill which would enact the most comprehensive energy policy in two decades.



Mr. Speaker, I can think of no higher priority for this Congress than finally enacting a comprehensive national energy policy as represented by H.R. 776. This legislation was developed by bipartisan consensus with substantial input from both the Administration and House Democrats. Democrats and Republicans will justifiably be able to claim major credit for this landmark legislation when it is finally enacted. However, it will not be enacted if certain amendments adopted by the House Interior Committee becomes a part of this bill since the President has raised the probability of a veto.

It is in everyone's interest for the House to adopt a bill which is acceptable to the Senate and the President, and to enact this bipartisan initiative which so clearly responds to a pressing national need.

Mr. Speaker, I urge you to push for the House's adoption of H.R.776 as reported by the House Energy and Commerce Committee.

On behalf of Enron Corp., Mike Muckleroy, Howard Karren and I want to express our most sincere appreciation for the magnificent banquet you hosted in The Great Hall. It was the perfect start for what we feel was a highly successful series of meetings with Mr. Sheng Huaren, President of Sinopec; Mr. Chen, Vice President of Sinochem; Mr. Yu, Assistant Minister - MOFERT; and Dr. Wang, President of CNPC.

As a direct result of these meetings we have three separate initiatives which were discussed that will result in technical teams from Enron visiting Beijing and various facilities in other parts of China over the next 60 days. Additionally, we will be meeting in Singapore with representatives of Sinochem with the objective of expanding our already successful contract which we have enjoyed for the past year and a half.

I would like to extend my personal invitation for you to include a visit to Enron's headquarters in Houston hopefully to be coordinated with your forthcoming trip to Spain. 

Global Warming and the Earth Summit Alliance to Save Energy Conference Washington, DC

June 23, 1992



I. <u>INTRODUCTION</u>

- o The Earth Summit that recently concluded in Rio is not the end of the discussion regarding "sustainable development," it is the beginning.
- o As we all know, the UNCED conference and events leading up to the conference generated an unprecedented amount of interest, media coverage and hype around the world. This international conference was not unlike many others -- treaties, speeches, photo opportunities, etc. The world's leaders have returned home and must begin the most important and most difficult task connected with UNCED -- the follow-through.
- In business, the follow-through is the key.

 Implementing the plan. Realizing the vision. Left in the wake of UNCED is the arduous work of transforming into reality the world's commitment to reducing greenhouse gas emissions and mitigating the threat of global warming.
- That is why I am delighted to be here this afternoon to share with you how the increased use of natural gas can cost effectively link America's quest for robust economic growth and aggressive environmental protection.
- o EPA administrator Bill Reilly, whom I believe did a fine job in Rio, despite very difficult circumstances, recently stated, "We're already fighting climate change in this country, and we're making profits while we are at it. A wider use of natural gas, and the increasingly efficient use of all types of energy:



these are the twin pillars of our climate change program. At the same time, they will be key elements of American economic growth in the next century."

- o I agree with Bill Reilly's view that a wider use of natural gas and increased energy efficiency will result in a more productive, prosperous and cleaner America. In my judgement, natural gas will play the dominant role in helping us achieve "sustainable development" -- not only in the U.S., but around the world.
- o All fossil fuels <u>are not</u> created equal. Natural gas is superior to coal and oil. I am convinced natural gas is the "bridge" fuel that will deliver us from the oil era to a renewable energy based economy. In a few moments I will outline just how superior natural gas is compared to the alternatives.

II. ELECTRIC POWER GENERATION AND TRANSPORTATION

- The electric power generation and transportation sectors of our economy are the chief contributors to air pollution in the United States. Addressing these two sectors of our economy seems to provide the most environmental bang for the buck.
- As far as power generation is concerned, in 1990, with more than half of all the electricity generated in this country being coal-fired, the electricity generation sector emitted 66 percent of all sulfur dioxide (SO2) emissions in our country, 37 percent of all nitrogen oxide (NOx) emissions and 35 percent of all carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions.



- o On the transportation front, <u>gasoline powered motor</u>
 <u>vehicles</u> contributed 40 percent of all NOx emissions and 30 percent of all CO2 emissions.
- o Increased use of natural gas as an electric power generation fuel and motor vehicle fuel in America's economy could dramatically improve our environment, lower electricity prices, reduce our trade deficit, enhance U.S. national security and create American jobs.

III. ENVIRONMENTAL BENEFITS AND ECONOMIC ADVANTAGES OF NATURAL GAS-FIRED POWER GENERATION

- In fact, <u>pollution prevention</u> is the key to achieving the twin goals of environmental protection and economic growth. In the case of electric power production, <u>cleaner can be cheaper</u>. The old paradigm suggests just the opposite: If you want a cleaner environment, you have to pay for it through higher electricity prices.

 Not true, cleaner air and lower levels of pollution are "free" when a natural gas fired power plant produces electricity, because natural gas power production is generally at least 30 percent cheaper, per Kwh, than coal fired power production.
- A cleaner environment is a byproduct of choosing the least costly economic alternative -- natural gas.
- In a special report to the August 1991 edition of Electrical World, Elizabeth Bretz, generation editor,
 wrote, "Few things in the electric utility industry are as clear as the advantages presented by today's gas

turbine-based combined-cycle powerplants. Their efficiency is substantially better than that of conventional steam/electric units, and they offer modular construction, a relatively low capital cost, small footprint, low emissions, minimal water consumption, and a short construction schedule - two to three years from planning to commercial service compared to five or more for a coal-fired facility."

New gas fired plants are also more energy efficient,
generating more electricity per unit of primary input
energy, than new coal plants. Gas fired combined cycle
systems now achieve thermal efficiencies of about 45%
and are expected to achieve efficiencies of 50% or
greater by the end of the decade. Coal fired plants
only achieve about 34% generation efficiency and have
not realized any increase in energy efficiency in more
than twenty-five years.

Environmental Benefits of Natural Gas-Fired Power Generation

- o What happens when a new natural gas combined cycle plant is built instead of a new, best technology coalfired facility? Quite simply:
 - 100% of the SO2 is eliminated, the main cause of acid rain;
 - 80% of the NOx is eliminated, the major contributor to smog; and
 - 95% of the particulate emissions are eliminated.
- Water consumption is also cut in half.

- o Not so incidentally, the natural gas plant also eliminates all solid waste. By comparison, a typical 500 MW coal plant creates about 350,000 tons of sludge annually and 125,000 tons of ash annually.
- o But, perhaps of greater long-term planning importance, the natural gas plant also <u>eliminates about 60% of the carbon dioxide (CO2) emissions</u> which is thought to be the primary global warming gas.
- o I am convinced global warming and CO2 emissions will be the next environmental battleground, if it isn't already. As you know, greenhouse gas emissions was one of the primary subjects discussed at the Earth Summit. I will come back to this in a few minutes.

Economic Advantages of Natural Gas-Fired Power Generation

- o Natural gas power generation is not only cleaner, it is cheaper.
- o Natural gas plants cost about 1/2 as much to build as coal plants.
- o Natural gas plants take about 1/3 as long to site and build as coal plants -- two to three years for gas plants vs. seven to eight years for coal plants.
- Natural gas plants -- even at long-term gas prices significantly above current levels -- also provide electricity at prices 30 percent cheaper than costs from a new coal plant.

- o As a real live comparison, Enron's largest natural gas power plant in Texas -- a 440MW plant at Texas City -- even with gas prices today (under a long-term contract entered into in 1985) which are approximately \$4.00/mcf, or about 2 1/2 times current prices, generates electricity which is 20-30 percent cheaper than electricity from the new coal lignite plants completed in Texas in the 1980's and 60-70 percent cheaper than power from the nuclear plants completed in Texas in the 1980's.
- o Finally, the natural gas plants are more reliable most data indicate they are available for dispatch
 about 95% of the time compared to about 80% of the time
 for coal plants and about 65% of the time for nuclear.

The Natural Gas Standard

- o Because of all of these advantages, Enron recently proposed that utility executives, regulators and others should adopt a "Natural Gas Standard".
- o The "Natural Gas Standard" is really quite simple. No other type of power generation plant should be built unless it:
 - Produces electricity cleaner than a natural gas combined cycle plant
 - Produces electricity cheaper than a natural gas combined cycle plant
 - Produces electricity more reliably than a natural gas combined cycle plant

- o I am obviously confident natural gas combined cycle power generation will win most of the time when all three of these standards are considered.
- the use of natural gas. Frankly, we do not need a mandate to win significant market share, we just need the opportunity to compete. Natural gas will win on the merits -- the environmental benefits and economic advantages, if allowed to compete in a free and fair competitive market. Unfortunately, in many cases regulatory or utility biases discourage the use of natural gas as a power generation fuel and distort the power fuels market.

Planning Beyond Compliance

- o As we all know, the Clean Air Act does not include any provisions to address carbon dioxide emissions.
- o Even though there are no laws on the books currently, the Earth Summit has left in its wake an <u>international</u> framework designed to reduce CO2 emissions.
- o The fact that global warming and CO2 emissions will be the next environmental battleground suggests that electric utilities currently in the process of developing compliance plans for phase I and phase II of the Clean Air Act Amendments of 1990 should consider CO2 emissions in their planning process.
- o Complying with the Clean Air Act by scrubbing coal emissions reduces a power generator's flexibility in responding to CO2 restrictions. We think natural gas can be a major part of an emissions reduction package



which will preserve flexibility. Unfortunately, many coal producing states appear to moving toward <u>mandating</u> scrubbers.

- o As I previously stated, natural gas power generation reduces CO2 emissions by about 60 percent compared to coal.
- A "no regrets" strategy based on natural gas co-firing, gas conversion or new gas-fired capacity would hedge the risk facing ratepayers resulting from potential CO2 emissions limits or taxes in the future. Again, the natural gas compliance "no regrets" option results in cheaper and cleaner power production now, and insulates the ratepayer from potentially higher electricity prices in the <u>future</u> if CO2 emissions are restricted.
- o I encourage electric utilities to plan beyond Clean Air Act compliance.
- o As Charles F. Kettering, famed engineer and inventor, once quipped, "We should all be concerned about the future because we will have to spend the rest of our lives there."
- Enron is meeting the power generation challenge. We formed a new company -- Enron Power Services -- to develop products and services exclusively for the power generation market. In fact, Enron Power Services is developing innovative solutions to Clean Air Act compliance and conversion issues.

o Enron Power Services offers a variety of flexible gas packages to meet the needs of utilities. We currently offer firm contracts for up to 15 years for specific volumes at predetermined or fixed prices.

Methane Emissions

- o I would also like to take this opportunity to address an issue that has been clouded by some misinformation lately. The issue of methane emissions, a potent greenhouse gas. The EPA will release shortly a report regarding methane emissions from the U.S. natural gas system. We are confident this report will ease the concerns some have expressed with respect to methane emissions from the natural gas system.
- o Other studies indicate that as much or <u>more methane</u> is released in the production and delivery system for <u>coal</u> than in the production and delivery system for natural gas. In fact, on a full cycle basis, the production of electricity from a coal fired plant results in about 75% greater methane emissions to the atmosphere than from a comparable natural gas fired plant.
- O These facts are substantiated by the work of the United Nation's Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. In addition, as I have mentioned, the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency has called for the expanded use of natural gas to curb global warming.

IV. A NATURAL GAS BASED TRANSPORTATION SECTOR

o In addition to the opportunities to prevent pollution and deliver lower electricity prices in the electric power industry, encouraging greater reliance on natural gas in motor vehicles and thus displacing foreign oil can also improve the environment, reduce our trade deficit, create American jobs and reduce our nation's vulnerability to oil shocks.

Environmental Benefits

A natural gas vehicle emits 80-90 percent less reactive hydrocarbons and carbon monoxide (CO), the main contributors to smog, than a conventionally fueled gasoline vehicle. Natural gas vehicles also reduce CO2 emissions by about 25 percent compared with a conventional gasoline vehicle.

Job Creation

- o The U.S. currently imports approximately 8 million barrels of oil per day, about 47 percent of total U.S. consumption. We are currently spending about \$4 billion per month on foreign oil, accounting for two-thirds of our total merchandise trade deficit and somewhat more than our total trade deficit with Japan.
- The transportation sector of the U.S. economy consumes more than 60% of all the oil we use in this country.

 Any measure designed to reduce vulnerability to oil shocks must take square aim at transportation. Natural gas vehicles run cleaner on a domestic fuel than gasoline powered vehicles which run on an imported fuel.



- o Displacing foreign oil with domestic natural gas creates American jobs.
- o For every 1 million barrels of foreign oil per day displaced, domestic natural gas demand is increased by 2 Tcf, 160,000 new U.S. jobs are created, \$4 billion of new investment takes place in the U.S. economy and our trade deficit is reduced by \$7.5 billion.
- o As the war in the Persian Gulf demonstrated, America is vulnerable to oil shocks. We must reduce our reliance on oil and reduce America's vulnerability to unstable energy supplies.
- o The U.S. has approximately 26 billion barrels of proved oil reserves. We have 35 billion barrels equivalent of proved natural gas and natural gas liquids reserves.

 More importantly, our country is believed to have at least 160 billion barrels equivalent of conventional natural gas resources yet to be discovered and made available for production using existing technology and at reasonable economics.
- o With such large proved and potential natural gas supplies, it is not defensible that we use about 75 percent more oil in our economy than natural gas and that we import from foreign sources almost half of the oil we use.

V. A NEW ENERGY AND ENVIRONMENTAL ORDER

o Natural gas is the third largest primary energy source worldwide, just behind coal. World demand for natural gas has doubled since 1970. Sustainable growth in the

developing countries means increased use of natural gas.

- o The benefits of natural gas fired power generation are not limited to the U.S. Demand for this clean fuel has spawned many business opportunities for Enron around the world.
- o Enron is building one of the largest gas fired cogeneration power plants in the world in Teesside,
 England. We are also pursuing power projects in Mexico, Turkey, Germany, Malaysia, Argentina, Australia and elsewhere.

VI. CONCLUSION

- o The difficult work now begins. The <u>follow-through</u> is critical to reduce greenhouse gas emissions and to mitigate the threat of global warming.
- o Plan beyond compliance with the Clean Air Act
 Amendments.
- O Carefully evaluate the natural gas based power generation options -- co-firing, conversion or new capacity.
- Natural gas power generation offers a "no regrets" compliance approach -- is cleaner and cheaper now -and I am confident -- will be even more so in the future.



- o The natural gas industry is committed to working with electric utilities and meeting their special needs and requirements -- long term gas arrangements are available.
- o All fossil fuels <u>are not</u> created equal. Natural gas is superior to coal and oil.

It is my understanding that the Gas Research Institute is working with the Danish Gas Technology Center to establish an international center for gas technology information under the auspices of the International Energy Agency. The office for this new center would be split between Washington and Copenhagen.

The purpose of the center would be to maintain a clearing house of information on new and emerging gas technologies. It would also conduct analytical studies and workshops on technology needs as well as facilitate technology transfer on an international scope.

Apparently, the FY 1993 budget includes \$500,000 for the establishment of the U. S. office for this international undertaking. I am writing primarily to urge that you and the Admiral support establishment of this center. In addition to the intrinsic value of the analysis and the exchange of information, I believe such a center would further establish, both here and abroad, the importance of natural gas to the Department of Energy and the U. S. Government.

If you need any additional information on this matter, I would be happy to provide it or obtain it.

Nos. 636 and ("Commission") holding in Order (hereinafter "Order Nos. 636, et seq.") that a shipper having capacity under a long-term firm transportation contract at a discounted rate, agreed to by the pipeline for such shipper based on the particular competitive situation of such shipper, may unilaterally transfer such capacity to other shippers and retain for itself all of the proceeds above the discounted rate to which it is contractually bound, is arbitrary and capricious, not supported by record evidence, not the product of reasoned decisionmaking, unjust, unreasonable, unduly discriminatory or preferential.

Whether the Commission's holding in Order Nos. 636, et seq., that a shipper having capacity under a long-term firm transportation contract at a discounted rate, agreed to by the pipeline for such shipper based on the particular competitive situation of such shipper, may transfer such capacity to other shippers and retain for itself all of the proceeds above the discounted rate to which it is contractually bound, unfairly prejudices existing firm capacity holders who either do not have discounts, or have smaller discounts, and are competitors marketing capacity for release; abrogates contracts and provides additional consideration above the consideration contractually agreed upon, contrary to judicial policy; and/or is unfair to interstate pipeline companies.
